1 Liqhobong Mine

Liqhobong

- One of the most attractive undeveloped kimberlite resources in the world
 - Third largest in contained carats after Gahcho Kue & Star (both in Canada)
 - Fourth largest in tonnes after Star and Orion South (both in Canada) and Gope (Botswana)







Project Update

Plant 1 condition at start up, Q1 2011

- mothballed plant not used for 2.5 years
- 65tph head feed name plate
- Designed to treat satellite pipe kimberlite (not weathered clay-rich main pipe)
- Secondary & tertiary crushers in series (diamond damage)
- Secondary crusher defective
- Plant not optimally designed (space constraint) challenges with maintenance & equipment replacement
- Old & inefficient gensets
- Poor security in recovery & sort house
- Inadequate water supply
- Limited fines tailings disposal capacity

Project Planning

♦ P65 – Commissioning & startup (+/-US\$1.3M)

- General plant refurbishment as part of re-commissioning
- ♦ Replacement of generators
- ♦ Security upgrades
- Access road refurbishment
- ♦ Camp upgrade

To re-start the plant at 65tph (0.440Mtpa)

♦ Project 100 (+/-US\$IM)

- Install wet front-end (grizzly feeder, scrubber, screen, slimes disposal line & associated conveyors & feed chutes)
- ♦ Install de-grit plant

To increase production from 65tph (0.440Mtpa) to 100tph (0.700Mtpa/0.3Mcts)

- Project 200 (+/-US\$6M)
 - ♦ Second DMS, secondary/tertiary crushers, surge bins, X-ray machines etc.

To increase production from 100tph to 200tph (1.4Mtpa/0.5Mcts)

2011 Progress

▶ P65 – getting the plant operational

- Refurbishing the plant replace pumps/screens/cyclones
- Replaced secondary crusher in April 2011
- Replaced 2 gensets in Aug 2011
- Installed new security surveillance cameras
- Installed sort boxes
- Capex US\$1.3M


Power Supply – New gensets



2011 Progress

▶ P100 – Installation of wet front-end & degrit plant

- Plant design
- Civils construction commenced in June 2011
- Plant commissioned in September 2011
- Name plate tonnage achieved in October 2011
- Capex +/-US\$I.0M

2011 Progress


Fines Tailings Storage Facility (Slimes Dam)

- Limited capacity in existing facility
- Engaged Golder & Associates to audit & review existing facility
- Recommendation to increase height of existing dam wall by 4m
- Extended life of facility by 12 18 months
- Use mining fleet to move required construction material ongoing
- Installed de-grit plant reduces amounts of material deposited inside dam
- Significant savings on capex



Fines Tailings Storage Facility - Oct 2011





Further Plant Modifications

▶ P100+ - Enhancing plant performance

Completed:

- Increased bottom cut-off (BCO) screen sizes ongoing
- Implemented security in recovery & sorthouse (Sort boxes + cages + cameras)
- Created raw water storage facility in satellite pipe pit (3 month buffer)
- Installation of de-grit Plant (increase life of fines tailings facility)
- Capex 0.65M

Planned:

- De-coupling secondary/tertiary crushers
- Install surge bin to ensure steady state feed to DMS
- Install wet X-Ray machine for coarse fraction

Expected Results

- To Achieve 120 150tph once all changes implemented end Q1 2012
- 120tph achieved in October 2011
- Capex US\$I.2M

Challenges & Opportunities

Challenges


- Diamond damage/breakage
- Access roads in inclement weather

Opportunities

- De-coupling secondary & tertiary crushers will reduce diamond damage/breakage - US\$/ct upside with recovery of big stones
- Security systems continually reviewed and evolving
- Increase in Bottom Cut-Off (BCO) will increase plant throughput and increased US\$/ct
- With P100 fully commissioned & optimised, processing of higher proportion of K5 (higher grade) will increase carats recovered





Outlook

Diamond market

 Growth in rough diamond prices expected to resume in 2012, driven by shortfall in supply

Cash flow

- Hold on major capital projects until market stability returns
- ~\$15M cash and ~\$3.5M diamond stock in Oct 2011
- Cash flow projections stress tested with significant drop in rough prices

Production

- Significant increases in production at Liqhobong and BK11
- \$45m pa revenue run rate targeted for Liqhobong for mid 2012
- Production target of 1 million carats per annum in 2014
